ALFA ROMEO 8C 2300 MONZA SPIDER BY ZAGATO

An early works car, chassis 2111044 was only numbered when it was registered to Scuderia Ferrari on 21 July 1932. There are several features to the chassis which indicate that it had a body different from the Zagato body which it carried in July 1932. The state of the car today is a real credit to Michael Crowley Milling, instrumental in the research and documentation of the car's history in 'The Legendary 2.3 Alfa Romeo 8C2300'. The car has been featured in the VSCC 'Bulletin' in a photo layout in the Summer 1995 issue and a history in the Autumn 1995 issue. Then it was featured in Classic & Sportscar for November 1995 and in the April 1996 issue to illustrate the 100 best cars feature (rated No. 3). Ian Livingstone acquired the car in September 2016. It has since been shown at Heveningham Concours, Pebble Beach Concours d'Elegance and Salon Privé Concours d'Elégance where it won Best of Show 2020.
